

Quran is a divine revelation and sent down with great miracles. The verses have the advantages of each. None of that can be wasted just because the reason that there are differences or similarities among verses. It is probable due to the lack of ability, many people cannot uncover the wisdom ('*ibrah*') stored on it, then so easily assuming that some of the verses tend to be boring because they have editors that are not much different. Without intensive attention, one would assume that many similarities in several verses of Quran are merely a *tikrār* (repetition). In fact, frequently there are wisdom found in these similarities and it will deliver one who analyzes it on an understanding of the dynamic formulation. Therefore, the need of efforts through the method of interpretation that can identify and accommodate the verses which are considered similar, should be fulfilled. And later, from the analyzed verses, will be found the silver lining. In addition, the disclosure of meaning in it also will color the dynamic of Quran's content which can bring the understanding, that each verse has advantages of others.

B. Identifying the Problems.

The restriction of the problems is very important, so that the research will not involve with many data studied. In a study, the problems need to limit to facilitate or accelerate the core of the study and to avoid irregularities in discussing the subject matter. Therefore, this research is restricted to the repetitions of Prophet Ibrahim's story in Quran with the same themes and using different redactions.

C. Problem to Address

Based on the background and objectives to be achieved in this study, the formulation of the problem is obtained as follows.

1. How are the aspects of repetition in Ibrahim's stories in Quran?
2. How are the repetitions with different editors in Ibrahim's stories in Quran?
3. What is the reason behind revealing the same themes verses with various redactions in Ibrahim's stories?

D. The Core of the Study

This research has the goals as follows.

1. Describing aspects of repetition in Ibrahim's stories in Quran.
2. Describing repetitions of different editors with the same themes in the story of Ibrahim in the Quran.

3. Finding the reason behind different editors with the same themes in the story of Ibrahim in the Quran.

E. Keywords

In order to make this study, guided and compatibility, it is better to confirm the concerning of the problems which will be explained through the list below:

1. **Stories:** Collection of speech that contains what leads to religion and provides guidance to the truth and orders in getting successful.⁷
2. **Ibrahim:** One of Allah's messengers. Father of Ismail and Ishaq, his name was Ibrahim Ibn Tārikh, Ibn Nāḥur, Ibn Sārūgh, Ibn Rāghū, Ibn Fāligh, Ibn 'Ābir, Ibn Shālih, Ibn Arfaghshadh, Ibn Sām, Ibn Nūh.⁸
3. **Repetition:** Repetition of a word or phrase more than once with the intent or meaning different, such as for strengthening, threats, exaltation and so forth.⁹
4. **Same themes:** the themes of the same story, both in terms of the order of the story, in terms of events or circumstances.

Concerning the study of repetition and story, it used the book of al-Zarkashī, *al-Burhān fī ‘Ulūm al-Qurān*, the book of al-Suyūṭī, *al-Itqān fī ‘Ulūm al-Qurān*, the book of Mannā’ al-Qaṭṭān, *Mabāhiṭh fī ‘Ulūm al-Qurān*. *Ẓāhirah al-Tikrār fī al-Qurān* that belongs to Dr. Abd al-Mun’im al-Sayyid Hasan and other additional books.

Reference to several books of commentary above is not meant to limit the use only for these books. Several other books of commentary that also used as a reference to support deepen and sharpen analysis study. To discuss the vocabulary or themes of Quran used *Mufradāt Alfādh al-Qurān* is the work of al-Rāghib al-Asfahānī (d. 425 AH). This book is the main reference for the interpreter of the Quran to study the meaning of vocabulary or themes in Quran. In order for the discussion of the meaning of the theme of Quran's themes more clear and complete, then the big

dictionary which was considered representative also used. In this case the authors use the *Lisān al-‘Arab*, the work of Abū al-Fadhl Jamāl al-Dīn Muhammad bin ‘Alī bin Ahmad bin Mukarran al-Anṣārī al-Afriqī bin Mandhur al-Miṣri (630 AH-711 AH)

To find and track the verses of the Quran, the author also uses *Mu'jam al-Mufahras li Alfādh al-Qurān al-Karīm*, by Muhammad Fuad 'Abd al-Bāqī.

3. Step of Analysis

The steps that will be used for carrying out this research are; First, selecting the verses of the story of Prophet Ibrahim in Quran. Second, classifying the themes of Prophet Ibrahim's story. Third, classifying the verses that have repetition in the same themes with different redactions. Fourth, the classification of the verses that has been collected, finding out the historical backgrounds if necessary, and looking for the interpretation of the verses which are studied in various books of interpretations. Then determining and performing the analysis of these interpretations. Fifth, do the writing by dividing the number of chapters and each chapter is further divided to several sub-chapters that serve to explain the results of the study and analysis that has been done previously. And finally, it will be served the conclusion regarding the purpose of this research.

H. The Outline of Writing

The outline of writing of this study will be divided into five chapters:

Chapter III: Data Offered and The Analysis of Repetition Verses of Ibrahim's Story. This chapter divided into two main parts. The first part is a collection of the verses of Prophet Ibrahim's story that experienced repetition. Therein also contains a collection of the verses of Prophet Ibrahim's story that experienced repetition with a different redaction in the same themes. The other part contains the interpretation of the scholars concerning the verses of Prophet Ibrahim's story that experienced repetition with different redactions in same themes in Quran. Next, those interpretations will be analyzed with comparison analysis.
